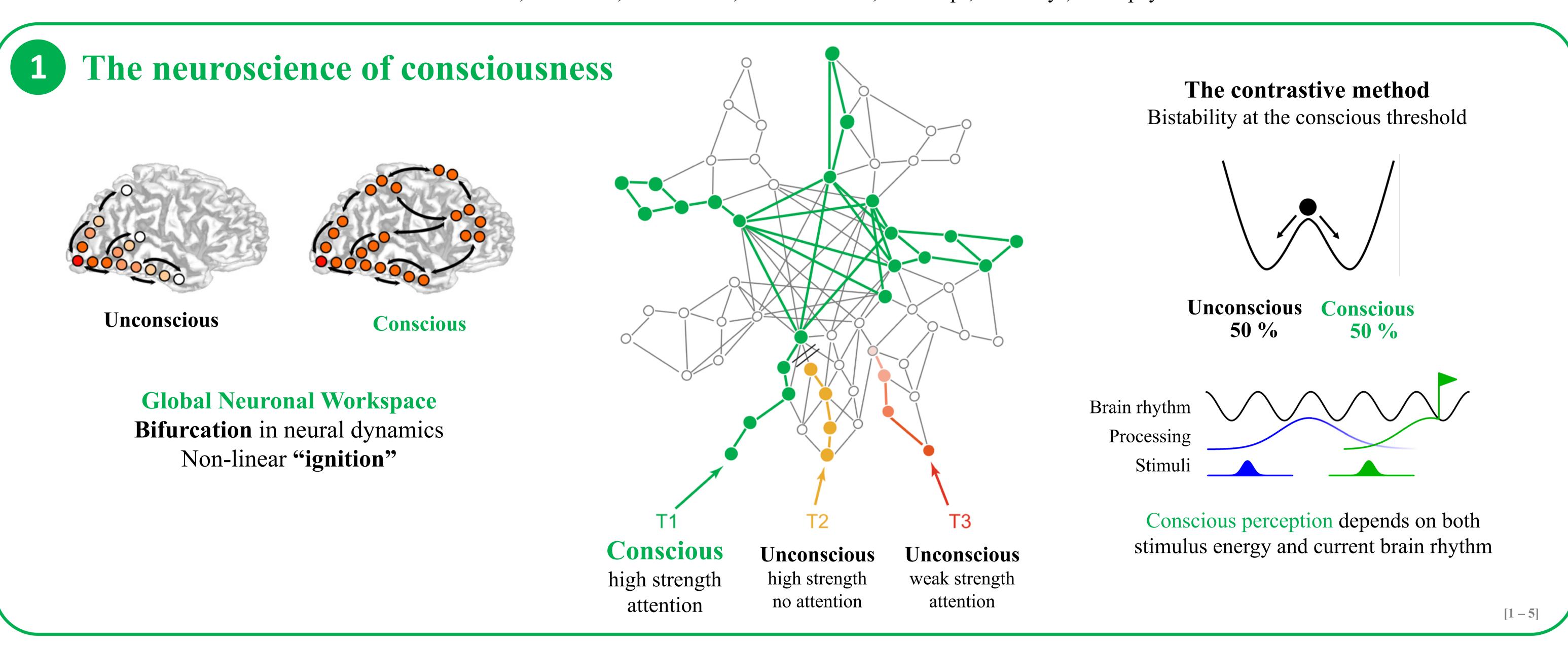


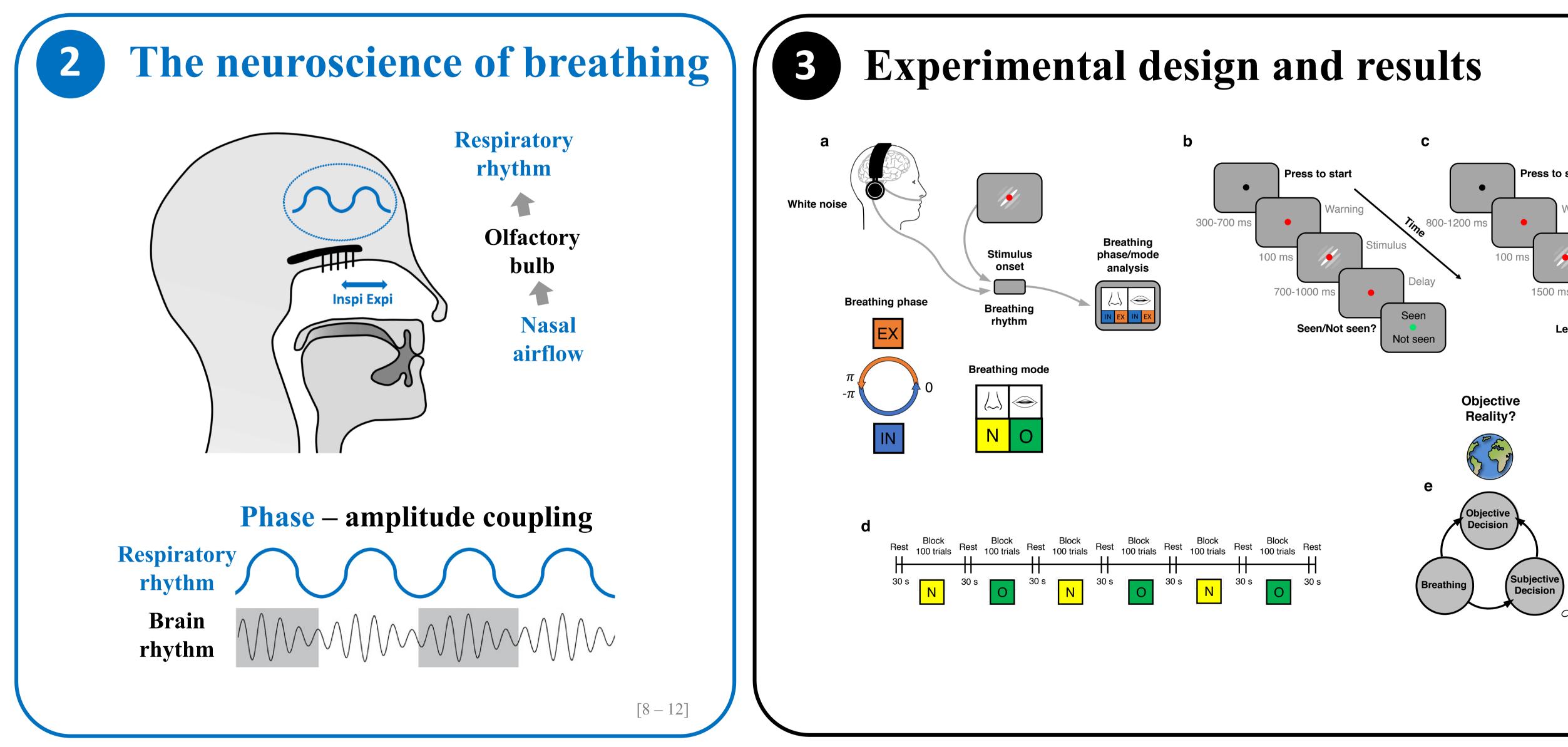

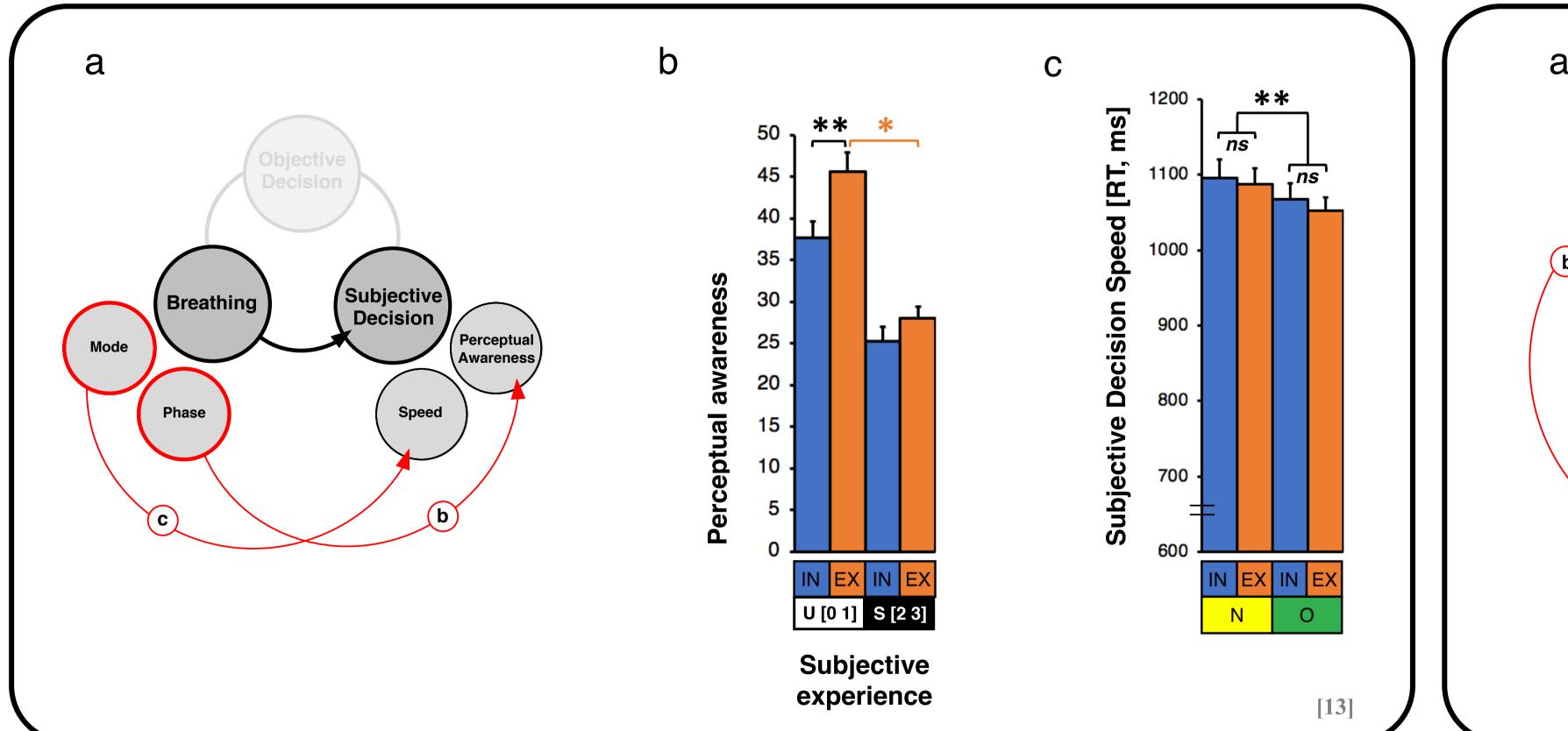

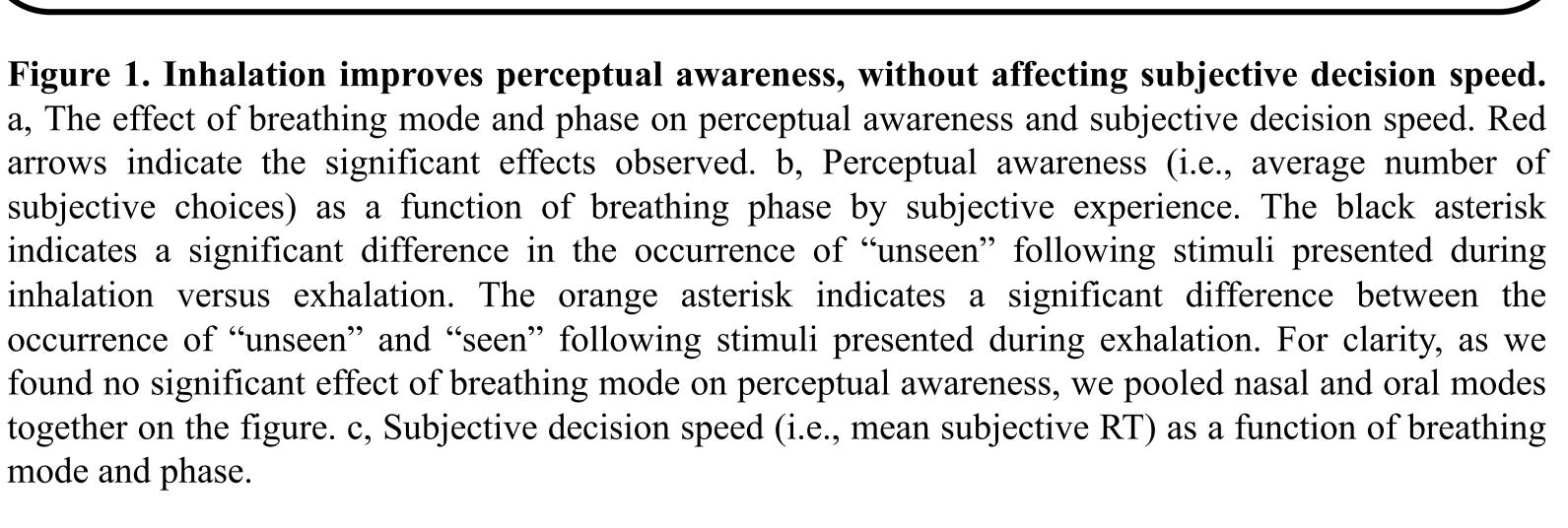

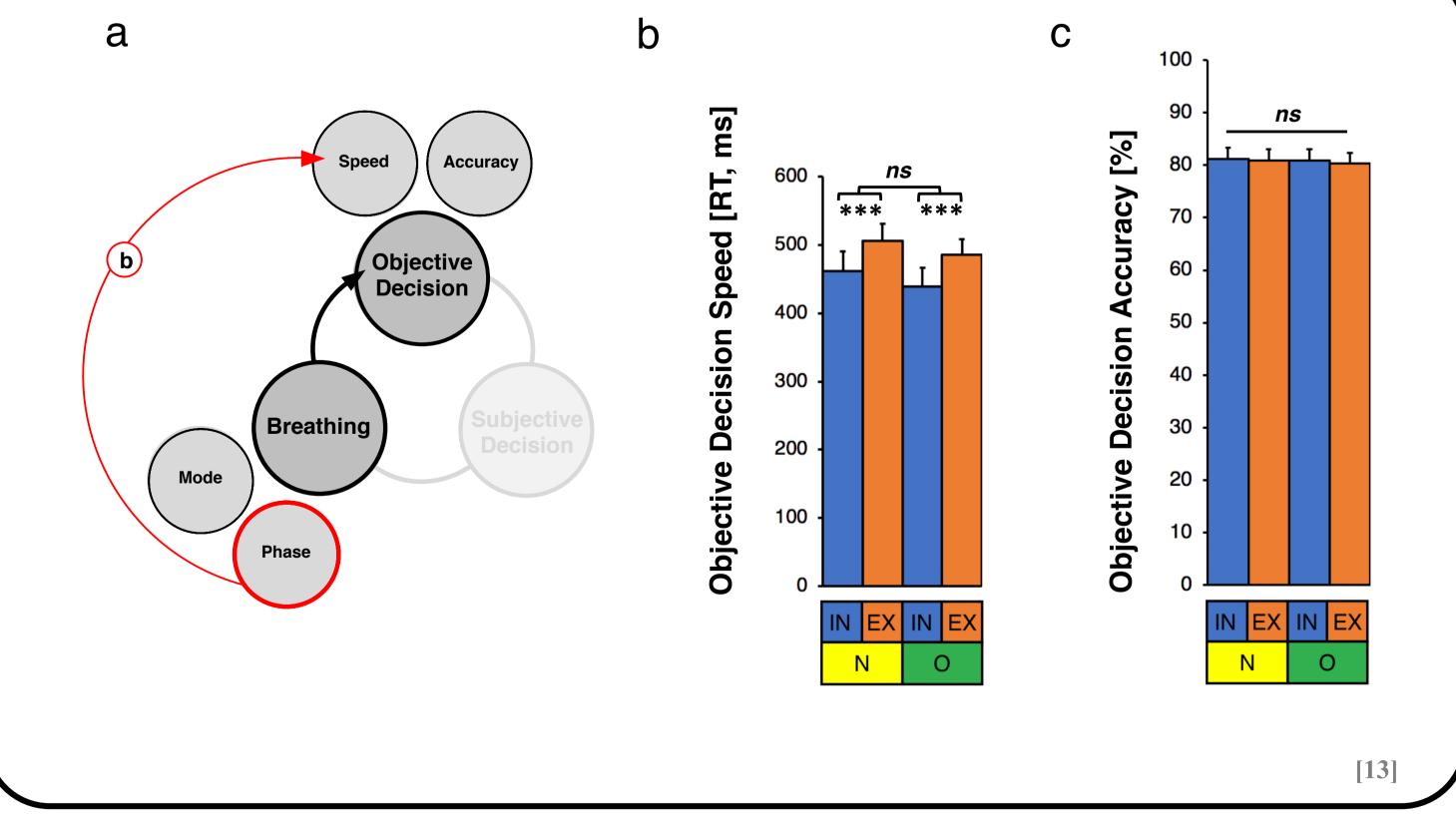


Figure 2. Inhalation speeds up objective decision-making, without affecting accuracy. a, The effect of breathing mode and phase on objective decision speed and accuracy. The red arrow indicates the significant effects observed. b, Objective decision speed (i.e., mean objective RT) as a function of breathing mode and phase. c, Objective decision accuracy (mean percentage of correct objective choices) as a function of breathing mode and phase.
